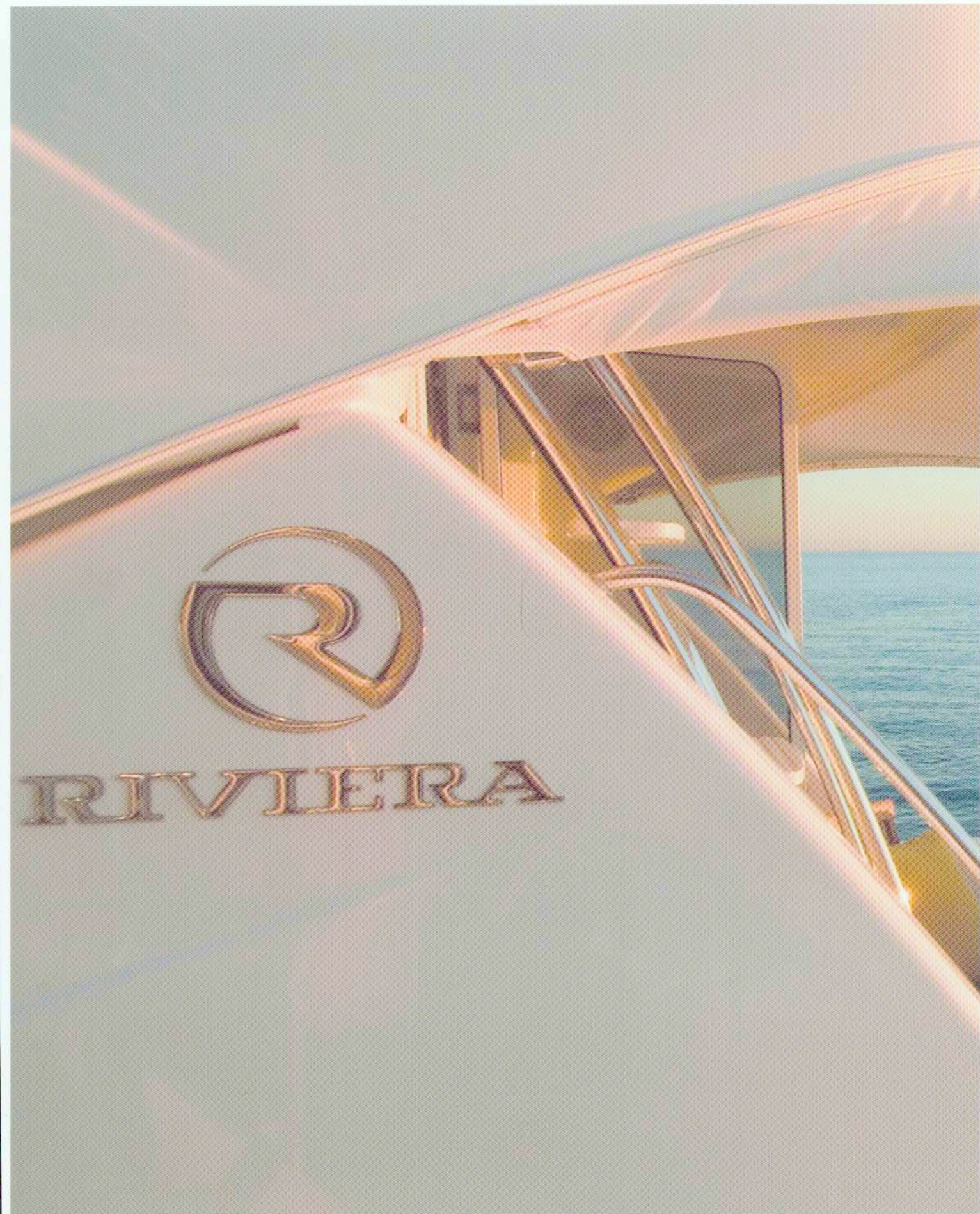

There's even some off-the-water seminar time, where guests can learn some fishing strategy so they can make the most of their time on the water.

Of course, a trip like this isn't all fishing.

The group stays at the stunning Los Suenos resort, with its 200-slip international marina, spectacular view properties, private beach club, challenging 18-hole eco-golf course, four-star Marriott hotel and 600-acre rainforest reserve.

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966 kilometres (600 miles) of beaches on two coasts. In a single day in Costa Rica, you can hike, go white water rafting through national parks, surf, snorkel and scuba dive off the Pacific and Caribbean shores, and, of course, fish.

And the odds of seeing wildlife are

greater in Costa Rica than anywhere else in the world. The country is home to 1,240 species of butterflies, 845 species of birds, 250 species of mammals, 160 species of amphibians, 218 types of reptiles and 1,013 varieties of fresh and salt water fish, including several endemic

species found nowhere else on the planet. With 27% of its land mass designated as national parks or reserves, that's hardly surprising.
